6 READING(S) FROM HOLY SCRIPTURE

A selection is made from the readings given for use during the Games. A reading from the Gospels should always be used.

7 SERMON OR other Exposition of the Word

8 REFLECTION

A time of silence, which may be followed by music, such as an anthem, or a meditative congregational song.

9 AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

If the service is taking place during the week, the Affirmation of Faith may be omitted.

EITHER

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son? I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate. was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead. Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
