- Please do not take photographs or video recordings during the service.

- This church has a loop system. To use it switch to T. If you have any problems with this system, please mention it to one of the stewards. The best place to sit for the loop system is within the central part of the cathedral and not on the wooden seats at the rear of the church.
- Offerings may be left in the plate at the back of the church after the service. Please use the gift-aid envelopes if you are a UK taxpayer. To make a financial pledge to this church, please ask a steward for a form.
- Please switch all mobile phones and electronic devices to 'silent'.
- Children and babies are very welcome at St Mary's Cathedral.
- Young Church is for children of any age, leaving during the first hymn and returning during the offertory hymn.
- BabySpace - there is a quiet space in the small meeting room for parents to be with infants. BabySpace is equipped with live audio feed, soft toys and feeding chair. Baby changing facilities are in the toilet through the side door nearest the altar.
- Security: those present are reminded either to keep all their belongings with them or to place them in a secure environment.
- Emergency evacuation. On the blast of a horn or the instruction to "leave the building now" those in most pews exit via the main west doors, turn right and out of the car park. Those in the crossing (choir, servers) and those with mobility restrictions sitting at the front exit via the south (font) door, go through the gate and turn right to Holyrood Crescent.






