The 2017 SEI Lecture will be delivered by the Revd Canon Professor David Jasper DD FRSA FRSE, Professor of Literature and Theology, University of Glasgow on 'The Role of the Arts in the Church of Tomorrow'. Thursday 26 October 2017 in the Memorial Chapel, University of Glasgow at 5.30pm. *'We live in a rapidly changing world to which the Church, as an institution, often finds it hard to adapt. The Christian Church has always had a creative, if sometimes uneasy, relationship with poetry, literature, the visual arts and music, and we need to nurture and care for this relationship in the future as part of our intelligent and prayerful mission in the world'.*

A Training Day for Diocesan Advisors was held in the General Synod Office on Thursday 24 August. Revd Peter Mead (Diocese of Brechin), Canon Kathy Collins (Moray, Ross and Caithness), Dr Ros Brett (Glasgow and Galloway) and Canon Dean Fostekew (Edinburgh) attended the sessions in person while Canon Ruth Innes (Edinburgh) and Revd Anne James (Aberdeen and Orkney) received training subsequently. The morning programme comprised short sessions on the ethos of the SEI community, on Common Awards procedures and protocols, and on evidence-based reporting and appraisal; the afternoon was spent getting to grips with reflective practice, perhaps the most vital activity in which a DA engages with his or her candidate. DAs are nominated by their Bishop and accompany the student throughout their formation, acting as a 'critical friend'.



The Revd John McNeil Scott has been appointed as the new Principal of the Scottish United Reformed and Congregational College to succeed Revd Dr Jack Dyce with effect from 2 October 2017. He will also assume the role of Training Officer for the National Synod of Scotland of the United Reformed Church, working closely with the Synod team to develop learning and development material to meet the future challenges of patterns of ministry within the Synod. We look forward to getting to know Revd Scott and hope that the SEI student cohort will continue to be enriched by the presence of URC students.

The Board of Examiners met on 22 August to scrutinise the previous year's marks and recommend progression or awards. We are delighted to announce that the Diploma (DipHE) in Theology for Ministry from York St John University was awarded to Jonathan Livingstone and the Revd Dr Clare Caley (shown right) with Merit and Distinction respectively, they being the last two students to come under the YSJU validation system; from now on Diplomas and Degrees will be awarded by Durham University under the Common Awards scheme. The first year of our Common Awards marking was likewise reviewed and deemed to be in order, so happily we can now progress smoothly into our second year with that validating system.
